ZELEFA'S STORY



Living in a small village of Munkunyu with the urge to change my life because of my terrible condition of lack of food and increasing sickness of my children two children, I struggled to make ends meet despite the hard work and resilience I had as an individual. I tirelessly worked in the fields, trying to cultivate enough crops to feed my family, but the unpredictable weather and lack of resources made it a scary task.

My life changed when Anasi Farmers started working in my village conducting training on modern agricultural sustainable farming methods like backyard gardening, organic fertilizers and manure and pest management. Providing us with high quality seeds and other farm tools enhancing my farming skills and capabilities since had become a beneficiary of their project.


As seasons passed, my farm began to flourish and could now have daily access to nutritious vegetables from my backyard garden that enabled me to not only feed my family more than once on nutritious meals but also earn 35,000 Ugandan Shillings weekly from the sale of my surplus produce in the local market. This additional income enabled me to send my children to school, breaking the cycle of poverty that had persisted for generations.

Anasi Farmers' agronomist kept on coming to my home proving me with extension knowledge on crop management and also linked me to the Sub County Agricultural Officer who has kept on supporting me and also inviting to other farmers' workshops and other education programs.

Today, I stand as a testament of Anasi's commitment to transforming lives of poor women in rural communities.
